

The Local Welfare Assistance Scheme (LWAS) helps people having problems with their money.



If you're at least 16 years old, live in Suffolk, and can show that you have problems with money, then you may be able to get money.

 Loft and wall insulation – Insulation helps keep heat in your home



• Winter warmth packs including free ways to keep your house warm and low-energy bulbs



 Temporary loan of heaters if yours break down



You may also be able to apply for Solar panels and renewable heating including heat pumps, if:



• Your total household income is less than £31,000



• Your home has a low energy rating



 and you are not connected to mains gas
