## **REGULATION 36 ADOPTION STATEMENT**

### **SUFFOLK MINERALS SPECIFIC SITE ALLOCATION DEVELOPMENT PLAN DOCUMENT (Incorporating Proposals Map)**

The Suffolk Minerals Specific Site Allocation Development Plan Document and Proposals Map were adopted by Suffolk County Council on 24<sup>th</sup> September 2009.

The Specific Site Allocation Development Plan Document allocates a number of sites suitable for the extraction of sand and gravel throughout Suffolk up to 2021. It also includes a Proposals Map.

Any person aggrieved by the Specific Site Allocation DPD or Proposals Map may make an application to the High court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that:

- a) the document is not within the appropriate power.
- b) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

An application must be made no later than 31<sup>st</sup> December 2009

Copies of this adoption Statement, the Specific Site Allocation DPD, the Proposals Map, the Sustainability appraisal and the inspector's report are available for public inspection during normal office hours at Endeavour House, the offices of the seven district/borough councils (Babergh DC, Hadleigh; Forest Heath DC, Mildenhall; Ipswich BC, Ipswich; Mid Suffolk DC, Needham Market; St Edmundsbury BC, Bury St Edmunds; Suffolk Coastal DC, Woodbridge; Waveney DC, Lowestoft) and at libraries throughout Suffolk.
