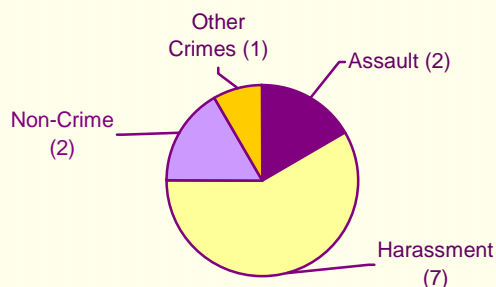

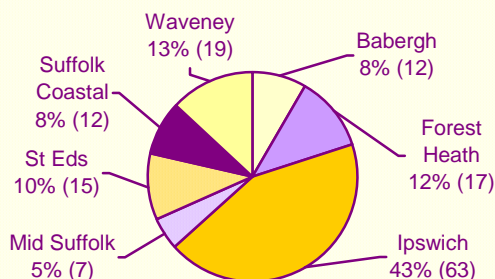

Percentage of racist incidents in Suffolk by CDRP July 2007 - September 2007

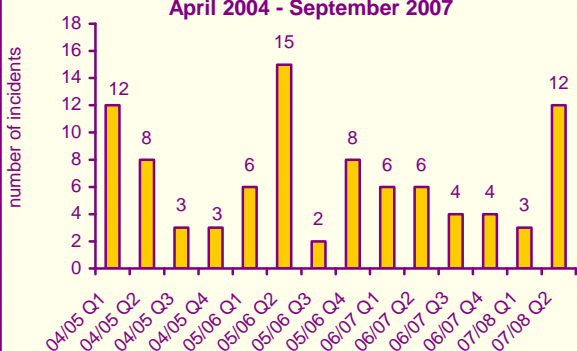


The second quarter of 2007-08 has 12 cases of recorded racial harassment.

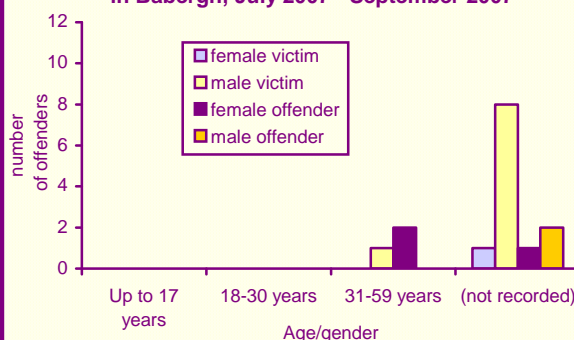

Racist incidents in Babergh April 2004 - September 2007



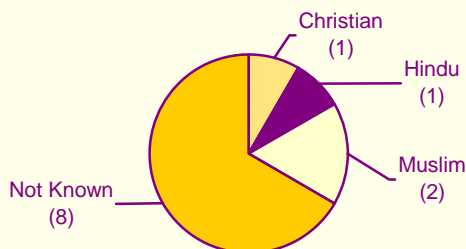
Age and gender of victims and offenders in Babergh, July 2007 - September 2007



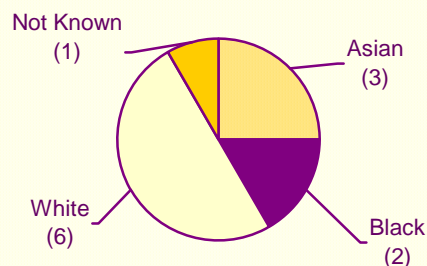
Racist incidents in Babergh have increased in Q2 07/08 compared to Q1 07/08 and doubled from Q2 06/07.

Out of the 12 incidents 11 of the offenders did not have a combination of age and gender recorded and only three of the victims had their age and gender recorded.

Recent Racial Harassment Initiatives

- Recorded 237 racist incidents across Suffolk during the first 6 months of 07/08 a decrease of 33% compared with the first half of 06/07
- Worked with NHS hospitals and PCT's to promote the RHI service and 'common reporting form'
- Worked with partner agencies to deliver the 'kick out racism' football campaign in the Autumn of 2007
- Supported Ipswich and Suffolk for Racial Equality to deliver drama workshops to students in colleges across Suffolk.
- Worked with partner agencies to deliver surgeries to support employees based at BT Martlesham.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE (113 incidents were reported in Babergh in Q2 2007/08)

In quarter 2 (July to September 2007) there were 113 reported incidents, with repeat victimisation of 28.3%. Children were present in 41.6% and Alcohol was a factor in 48.7%.

Local research shows that those offenders where alcohol is a factor in domestic violence can also be anti social to neighbours, commit other offences within the home or in a public place. A conference to raise the issues of domestic violence and abuse where alcohol is also a factor and to share best practice is planned for 29th November at Trinity Park, Suffolk Showground, Ipswich.

Initial outcomes from the Specialist DV Courts in the Ipswich & District Magistrates court area (which includes some of Babergh) are very positive. Between April 11th (when they started) and end of June the rate of successful prosecution increased to 90% compared to an average of 79.8% for all of Suffolk (including the courts without the SDVC model). Following recommendations by the Suffolk County Council Scrutiny and the Local Criminal Justice Board the steering group has been asked to consider how this best practice can be incorporated throughout Suffolk Magistrates court system.

During White Ribbon campaign November 25th to December 10th there are various activities to raising awareness of the harm domestic violence causes families and communities. These include in Babergh the launch by the Local Forum of a Survivor's Stories DVD on Monday 26th.
