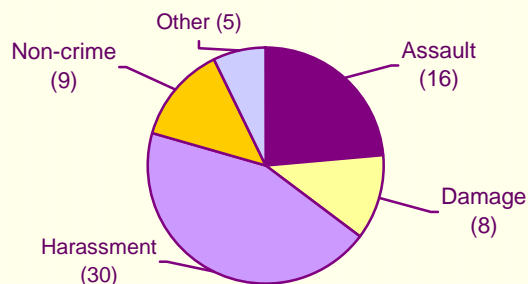

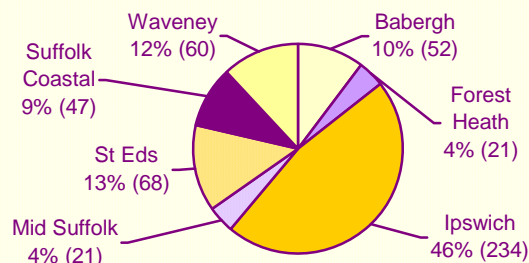

Type of racist incident in St Edmundsbury April 2007 - March 2008



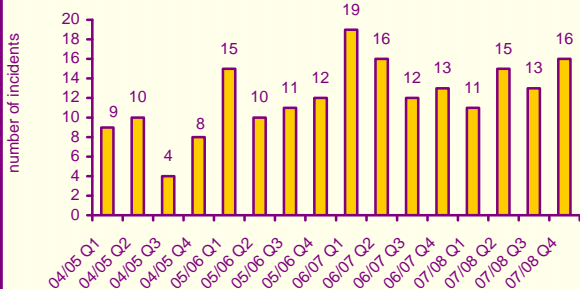
Percentage of racist incidents in Suffolk by CDRP April 2007 - March 2008



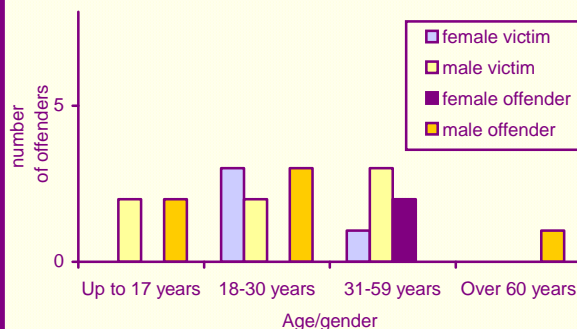
* **Non-Crime** - These are hate incidents reported to the police that do not amount to a criminal offence. Source: Suffolk Constabulary

Racist incidents in St Edmundsbury April 2004 - March 2008



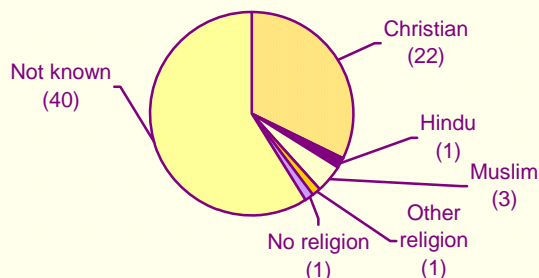
Age and gender of victims and offenders in St Edmundsbury April 2007 - March 2008



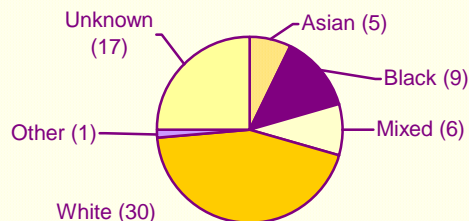
The number of incidents in St Edmundsbury have increased through 07/08 however recorded incidents are lower than 06/07.

Recent Racial Harassment Initiatives

- Recorded 512 racist incidents across Suffolk, an increase of 15% on 2006/2007.
- Launched two third party reporting centres at the Ipswich Mosques aimed at encouraging community members to report racial harassment.
- Worked with partner agencies in delivering the “Kick Racism” out of football campaign in the Autumn of 2007.
- Referred 30 service users into a specialist counselling service who had suffered racist abuse or hate crime.
- Supported the “Glassboy” travelling puppet project across Suffolk schools.
- Worked with CYP to deliver an Anti Bullying conference to Head Teachers across Suffolk.
- Improved our client satisfaction from 79% in 2006/2007 to 81% in 2007/2008.
- Supported the “Glassboy” travelling puppet project across Suffolk schools.
- Worked with NHS hospitals and PCT’s to promote the RHI service and ‘Common Reporting Form’.
- Produced literature in partnership with Children and Young People’s Services to support parents and children in a school setting.
