## **REGULATION 36 ADOPTION STATEMENT**

### **SUFFOLK MINERALS CORE STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT PLAN DOCUMENT**

#### **(Incorporating development control policies and proposals map)**

The Suffolk Minerals Core Strategy Development Plan document and proposals Map were adopted by Suffolk County Council on 25<sup>th</sup> September 2008.

The Core Strategy sets out the vision, objectives and spatial development strategy and its policies will guide mineral development throughout the County up to 2021. It also comprises a set of development control policies and a Proposals Map.

Any person aggrieved by the by the Core Strategy DPD or Proposals Map may make an application to the High court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that:

- a) the document is not within the appropriate power.
- b) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

An application must be made no later than 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2008

Copies of this adoption Statement, the Core Strategy DPD, the Proposals Map, the Sustainability appraisal and the inspector's report are available for public inspection during normal office hours at Endeavour House, the offices of the seven district/borough councils (Babergh DC, Hadleigh; Forest Heath DC, Mildenhall; Ipswich BC, Ipswich; Mid Suffolk DC, Needham Market; St Edmundsbury BC, Bury St Edmunds; Suffolk Coastal DC, Woodbridge; Waveney DC, Lowestoft) and at libraries throughout Suffolk.
