RACIAL INCIDENTS (10 took place in Babergh during Q1 & Q2 2008/09)

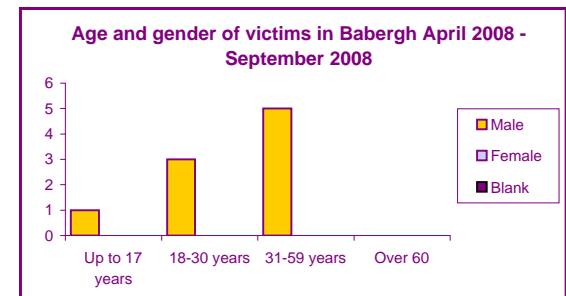


* **Non-crime** - these are hate incidents reported to the police that do not amount to a criminal offence. Source: Suffolk Constabulary

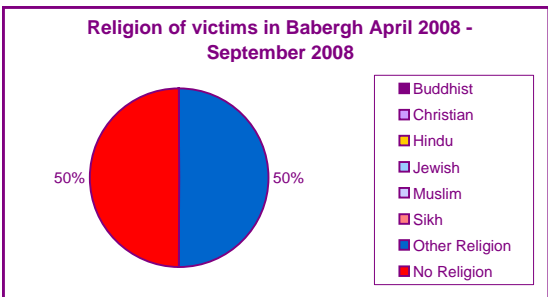
Based on 261 incidents across Suffolk.



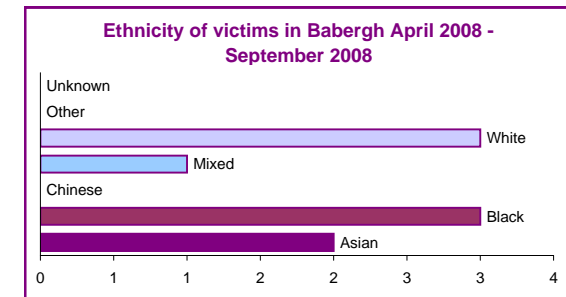
There were 4 incidents where the age and gender of the offender were not known.

- Involved in developing the school guidance on dealing with bullying and harassment.

The future:

Developing a Partnership to address 'Hate Incidents' in Suffolk

Hate Incidents are defined as "any incident, which may or may not constitute a criminal offence, which is perceived by the victim or any other person, as being motivated by prejudice or hate" (ACPO:2005). They therefore can be anything from name calling to assault or criminal damage. Such incidents can be because of Race, Faith, Disability, Sexual Orientation, Transgender, Age, or Gender.

Since 1998 the Racial Harassment Initiative at Suffolk County Council has supported children and adults who have experienced a racist incident. In 2009, Suffolk County Council will expand the Racial Harassment Initiative and work in partnership with Suffolk Constabulary and Victim Support Suffolk to support children and adults who experience incidents in relation to Race, Faith, Disability, Sexual Orientation, Transgender, Age, or Gender.

A three year strategy will be devised and implemented to develop the service to raise awareness, encourage reporting (including email, text messaging, easy to complete forms), identify gaps and to provide support.
