The Inspector granted planning permission in accordance with the application C06/1902/CRG3, without conditions 1, 11, 12, and 13 previously imposed in November 2005. The Inspector retained the other conditions imposed in 2005 so far as they are still subsisting and capable of taking effect and added three further conditions to address issues arising from the appeal Hearing relating to conservation of the bio-diversity interest that has developed in the site, the management of the weed growth over the site, and the monitoring of soil handling operations when site restoration takes place which is expected to be in 2011. The appellant's application for Award of Costs of bringing the appeal against the Council's decision was dismissed.</p>
Land adjacent Ten Tree Road Industrial area, Gt Waldingfield	Non compliance with conditions 4, 5, 6, of planning permission B06/01151 for waste recovery & transfer site	B06/01151		Apr-08	<p>Background provided in Agenda Item 15 to 06 March 2008 Committee.</p> <p>The Enforcement Notice requires:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) Cease the importation of waste to the Waste Transfer Site, within 5 days. ii) Provide the access improvements required by conditions 4 and 5c of permission B06/0115 in accordance with approved drawing 103, within 2 months. iii) Provide an even, continuous, bound surface over the length of the access track between the site and the public highway to a width of 7 metres throughout in accordance with the 'Thackeray specification' (road repair and surfacing specification) dated April 2006, within 4 months. <p>The Notice has been appealed and will be dealt with through Public Inquiry on 25 November 2008. The requirements of the Notice are held in abeyance until the appeal is determined.</p>
Land at Bardwell Hall, BARDWELL	Unauthorised use of land for waste storage and processing, deposit of waste and storage of plant, machinery, and vehicles used in connection with waste handling operations			Aug-07	<p>A joint Public Inquiry into appeals against Notices issued by Suffolk County Council as Waste Planning Authority and St Edmundsbury Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority in respect of other breaches of planning control took place 17 – 20 July 2007.</p> <p>The appeals were dismissed on 28 August 2007, with full Costs of dealing with the appeal awarded to both the County and Borough Council. The appellant/operator has now paid the Council's costs in full amounting to £16,000.</p> <p>On 16 January 2008 the requirements were substantially still in breach - only part of the area had been cleared of soil heaps, waste processing and other machinery and items unconnected with agriculture remained on the Notice land, and a substantial amount of waste soils and rubble remained in apparent stockpiles on the land.</p>
