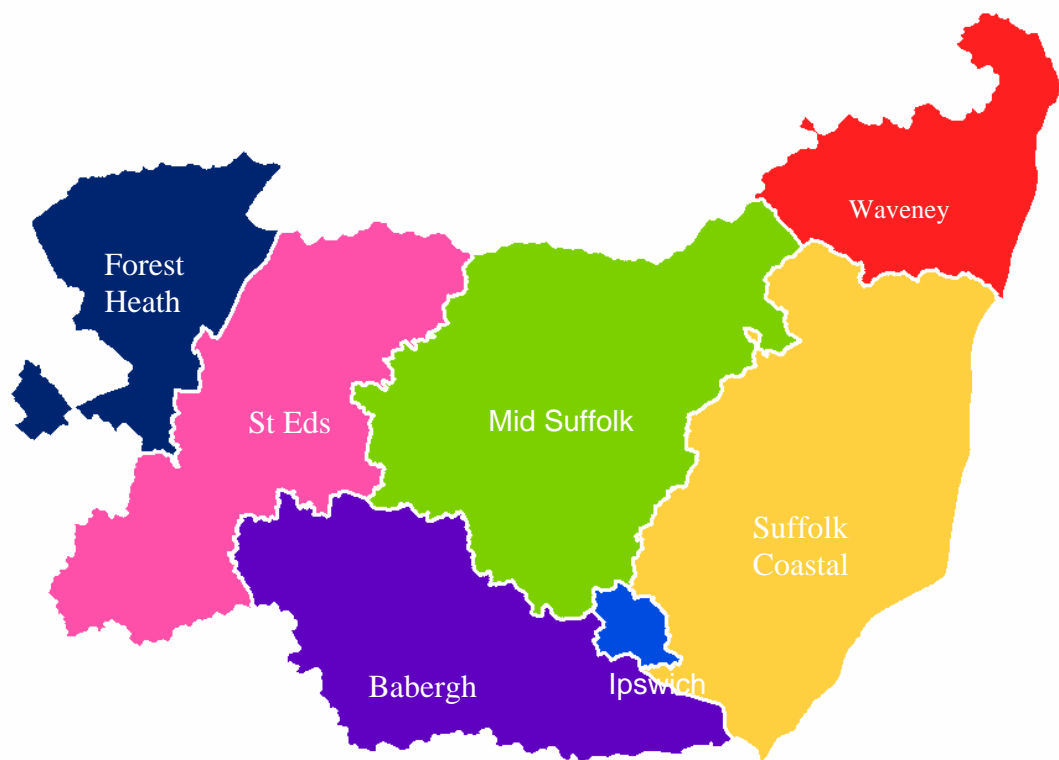

We share a collective commitment to work together to combat all forms of domestic abuse and to help make all homes in Suffolk 'fear free zones' and places of safety.

Overview of Strategy and Organisational Response

Strategy and Commitment to Address Domestic Abuse

The multi-agency strategy 2008 – 2011 is focused on providing a framework for working together to address domestic abuse in Suffolk by coordinating the priorities of the Community Safety Partnerships and other lead agencies. The strategy is supported by a delivery plan summarising the scope and range of activities, LAA targets, local delivery plans and outlining the contributions to address domestic abuse from all partners. The overarching aim is to achieve a reduction in domestic abuse and repeat victimisation, and increase the safety of those experiencing violence and abuse through:

- Prevention and Early Intervention
- Protection and Justice
- Support for Victims

County Domestic Violence and Abuse Forum

The County Forum is multi-agency partnership with a wide membership from statutory and voluntary sector organisations in Suffolk. The forum meets quarterly and is committed to tackling both the causes and effects of domestic violence and abuse in Suffolk and to support the work of local forums by promoting communication and best practice. The Forum Chair is the County Councillor responsible for Public Protection, members include representatives from:

Local Domestic Abuse Forums

Local Domestic Abuse Forums provide a focus for local developments and have the lead role in delivering local publicity campaigns and events, delivering ongoing activities to raise awareness with staff, local organisations and communities.

Local Forums have a key role in the delivery of action plans being developed by District and Borough Community Safety Partnerships. Supporting and coordinating their contribution to local issues and services is a continuing priority, aimed at cohesive development and delivery at a local level and supporting county-wide activities and projects that have an impact locally. Safer Suffolk Partnership Board

The Safer Suffolk Partnership Board is the strategic body responsible for the delivery of the Local Area Agreement targets in respect of safety, coordinating directing and steering the local Community Safety Partnerships and implementing the National Drug and Alcohol Strategies in order to reduce the harm to individuals and communities in Suffolk.

Suffolk County Council Community Safety Unit

Suffolk County Council's Community Safety Unit provides a strategic lead and framework for domestic abuse developments. The Community Safety Unit works in partnership to coordinate the delivery of local actions plans to meet LAA targets and national indicators and to assist local commissioning arrangements.

Community Safety Partnerships

Within Suffolk there are five local Community Safety Partnerships, each aligned to district/borough councils with the exception of Western CSP which formally merged the Mid Suffolk, St Edmundsbury and Forest Heath CSPs on May 1st 2007. Following a strategic assessment led by the Community Safety Unit all local Community Safety Partnerships have agreed domestic abuse as a key priority in a 3 year rolling plan.

In Suffolk the importance of focussing on reducing crime including domestic abuse and antisocial behaviour is recognised, along with wider issues such as reducing the fear of crime and helping vulnerable people live independently, all of which contribute to a happier, safer, more cohesive community. The Role of Suffolk Safeguarding Boards

The **Suffolk Safeguarding Children Board** has made domestic abuse a priority and in response developed new 'Guidance for dealing with Domestic Violence and Incidents of Domestic Abuse where Children are Members of the Household'. This is implemented for all agencies working with children and young people and extends and compliments 'Working Together to Safeguard Children from Harm'.

The **Suffolk Adult Safeguarding Board** is an inter-agency forum which promotes the protection of vulnerable adults from abusive behaviour and practice. Domestic abuse accounts for a high percentage of the work of Adult Safeguarding.

The Suffolk Strategy for Parenting Support

In Suffolk, **The Children's Trust Partnership** supports the view that positive parenting will provide the best possible outcomes for children and young people. The aim is to ensure all parents, who need support, will be able to benefit from a range of accessible services. The strategy promotes effective early intervention and understanding between agencies and acknowledges that domestic abuse is an issue that impacts on positive parenting,

2 Responding to Domestic Abuse in Suffolk

Community Safety Partnerships *Creating a safer, stronger Suffolk*

The Crime and Disorder Act 1998 recognised that the Police alone are not the sole agency responsible for the reduction of crime and disorder or public safety. Community Safety Partnerships have a statutory duty to work with other local agencies and organisations to develop and implement strategies to tackle crime and disorder including anti-social and other behaviour adversely affecting the local environment, as well as the misuse of drugs in their local areas. Community Safety Partnerships brings together:

- Suffolk County Council
- District / Borough Councils
- Suffolk Police
- NHS Suffolk
- Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service
- Suffolk Probation
- Suffolk Drug and Alcohol Action Team

Community Safety Strategic Assessment

The Strategic Assessment identifies the issues that are most relevant to the local area in terms of crime, disorder, community safety, anti-social behaviour and substance misuse. Data and intelligence from all Community Safety Partners is collected, analysed and informs the key findings and recommendations for prioritisation contained within the assessment.

These key findings and recommendations are considered by the Community Safety Partnership when drafting and revising their rolling three-year plan. In addition the Strategic Assessment must outline the priorities to escalate to the county level. The annual cycle of assessments is intended to compliment and refresh Local Area Agreements. Domestic Abuse is recommended as a priority.

Community Safety Partnership Action Plans

Community Safety Partnership Action Plans take forward the recommendations of the strategic assessment and identify the ways in which the recommendations will be delivered. Although Community Safety Partnerships work to a three-year plan (to ensure it tackles short, medium and long term priorities) the plan will also be revised annually to reflect any new priorities emerging from the strategic assessment. All Community Safety Partnerships In Suffolk have made Domestic Abuse a priority which is reflected in local action plans.

Protection and Justice for Victims of Domestic Abuse

Specialist Domestic Violence Courts

Suffolk Criminal Justice Board is supporting the provision of Specialist Domestic Violence Courts in Suffolk. Magistrates and court officials have been specially trained and other measures are in place aimed to reduce the rate of attrition and improve successful prosecutions of perpetrators. Dedicated courts for domestic violence cases are held on one day each week at Ipswich, Lowestoft and St Edmundsbury Magistrates courts.

Independent Domestic Violence Advocacy

The introduction of Specialist Domestic Violence Courts is supported by the development of an effective and accredited trained advocacy service (IDVA) aimed to support and encourage all victims to participate with the prosecution service, reduce attrition and support better outcomes for victims and families. The service is in place in Ipswich and is now extended to cover the courts in Lowestoft and Bury St Edmunds. The IDVA service provides dedicated support and works alongside other outreach services provided by Women's Aid, Victim Support Suffolk and other agencies

Multi-agency Risk Assessment Conferencing (MARAC)

Based on a national model the MARAC aims to identify all high risk domestic violence and to reduce the risk of serious harm or homicide for a victim and to increase the safety, health and well-being of victims – adults and any children. Information about the risks faced by victims, the actions needed to ensure their safety and the resources available locally are shared and used to create a risk management plan involving all agencies. The focus is on both adult and young people as victims and coordinates with child protection arrangements. See www.suffolkscb.org.uk for more information about keeping children safe.

Crown Prosecution Service (CPS)

The CPS work within a multi-agency approach to prosecute domestic abuse cases effectively while recognising that criminal proceedings are just one element of this approach and that criminal and civil law may need to be used in conjunction. However, stopping domestic violence and bringing perpetrators to justice remain a priority.

Perpetrator Intervention Suffolk Probation Area is delivering the National accredited Integrated Domestic Abuse Programme (IDAP) in Lowestoft, Ipswich and Bury St Edmunds. Dedicated Women's safety Workers are employed to provide support to partners or ex partner victims and use safety planning techniques (Tools for Practitioners) to promote the safety of victims and their families. Suffolk Probation Area also works extensively with individual perpetrators using various models of intervention as laid out in guidance produced by the National Offender Management Service. Outside of Probation other providers, funded by Suffolk County Council and Community Safety Partnerships are introducing voluntary Early Intervention Perpetrator Programmes, throughout Suffolk.

Suffolk County Council - Domestic Abuse Training

Improving the way we deal with domestic abuse in Suffolk is a priority and one of the ways we are tackling this problem is through a programme of multi-agency training, annual conferences and other developmental opportunities that are open to staff from agencies in Suffolk.

Our programme is based on developing best working practice and forms an integral part of the County Council's and our partner's collective commitment to work together to address the causes and effects of domestic abuse in Suffolk. Staff in contact with and working with victims / survivors, including children, need to have a developed level of skills and knowledge to enable them to carry out their roles effectively. This includes:

- Being able to recognise different forms of abuse; understand the nature and dynamics of abusive relationships and adopt safe practices at an appropriate level
- Being able to recognise domestic abuse as a significant factor in the safeguarding of children and adult safeguarding and identify those at risk of harm.
- An awareness of the legislative framework surrounding domestic abuse including the role of specialist domestic violence courts, staff guidance and local services
- Being able to work effectively with others both within their own agency and across organisational boundaries

Training is aimed at providing the building blocks for effective responses at all levels. The core module (level 1) broadly relates to a wide range of roles and responsibilities. Level 2 and 3 are intermediate and specialist modules aimed at those with defined and designated roles often working with challenging and complex situations

3 Responding to Domestic Abuse Support Services

Police Victim Care Centres

There is a Victim Care Centre in each policing area across the County – Lowestoft, Ipswich and Bury St Edmunds - accommodating the police Child Protection Team and other specialist police services for victims of domestic and other crimes and witnesses

Each centre is well equipped to ensure victims and witnesses have a high level of support and aftercare through the investigation process and to help them cope with the impact of a traumatic crime. Specialist officers work in child abuse investigation and highly trained Victim Care Officers work with victims of rape, sexual assault, domestic abuse and hate crime, this work includes:

- **Sexual Offences** – obtaining evidence by interview, medical examination and subsequent care and support to the victim in conjunction with other agencies.
- **Domestic Abuse** – risk assessment and safety planning, obtaining evidence by interview, providing support and guidance to the victim as well as Area police investigators, there is a particular emphasis on repeat victims
- **Hate Crime** – obtaining evidence by interview, providing support and guidance to the victim as well Area police investigators.
- **Vulnerable / intimidated witnesses** – as legislation changes more disadvantaged victims and witnesses will be able to access the criminal justice system, particularly through video interviews and other 'special measure' such as protective screens in courts and live-link CCTV.

Victim Care Officers will remain responsible for supporting a victim or witness through the processes involved, providing expertise in both collation of evidence as well as professional aftercare. Specifically with regard to domestic abuse, Victim Care Officers have a key role in working with victims who seek to retract their allegations.

Emergency accommodation is provided through 3 women's refuges in Suffolk, located in Bury St. Edmunds, Lowestoft and Ipswich, additional refuge accommodation is available in Diss, Norfolk. Refuge services provide a safe and supportive environment for women and their children where they can recover from the traumatic effects of all types of domestic abuse. All refuges in Suffolk provide emotional and practical support based on empowering women to make safe choices. Staff are highly trained to work with women and children to develop safety plans and support packages based on individual need as well as advising on benefits, debt, housing and other related issues.

What is it?

The FREEDOM programme is a 12 week Course. All programmes are FREE

Who is it for?

The programme is open to any woman who wishes to learn more about the reality of domestic violence and abuse

Where is it?

FREEDOM programme groups are being run across Suffolk, many are taking place in Children's Centre's with crèche facilities. Groups are facilitated by trained practitioners and domestic abuse specialists from the voluntary sector.

What are the aims of the programme ?

- To help women to understand the beliefs held by abusive men and in so doing, recognize which of these beliefs they have shared
- To illustrate the effects of domestic violence on children
- To assist women to recognize potential future abusers
- To help women gain self-esteem & the confidence to improve the quality of their lives
- To introduce women to community resources such as Women's Aid, Police Victim Care Centres, and other local support and national services

Home-Start in Suffolk – is a voluntary scheme which offers friendly, flexible support and practical help to families with at least one child under the age of five.

Home-Start Babergh is a local charity offering support, friendship and practical help to parents with young children, delivering a unique service, recruiting and training volunteers who visit families at home, we help give children the best possible start in life. Our qualified Family Group Leader also runs three family groups, meeting each week in Sudbury, Great Cornard and Hadleigh.

Home-Start Babergh supports parents, many with mental health and learning difficulties, as they grow in confidence, help improve self esteem and strengthen their relationships with their children and widen the links with the local community. The majority of referrals we receive are from statutory agencies (Health Visitors, GP's, CMHT's, Midwives, Social Care etc) although families can also self refer.

Home-Start Babergh also offers a much needed and valuable support service to the statutory agencies and our support often empowers families to improve outcomes for themselves, potentially reducing the need for intervention elsewhere.
