Dear Matthew,

Many thanks again for your e-mail of the 10th July 2008 confirming that Natural England agree with our conclusion that there will be no significant adverse effects as a result of the proposals outlined in the Appropriate Assessment dated 5th June 2008 (amended today to show correct grid references).

You mention that there are two factors to be addressed in the future: post-extraction restoration and post-restoration management. The former is dealt with by SCC's Mineral Core Strategy (2007) and the latter will require an extended site management plan to be agreed in the future between the landowner, Natural England and RSPB.

I am quite happy to set that particular hare running by including Tim Cowan from RSPB in this message in the hope that he will be willing and able to discuss this matter with us and the landowner at some time in the future.

Extraction is expected to last between 8 and 10 years so we do have a little time to finalise this.

Thanks again for your assistance in this matter.

[The component SSSI is listed as Cavenham-Icklingham Heaths, however, the grid references provided fall within Breckland Farmland SSSI.](#)

[Natural England is able to agree with the conclusion of no significant adverse effect provided that mitigation for the loss of habitat is provided as described within the report, particularly with regard to the following:](#)

- [Following extraction, the site is restored to better quality habitat for the SPA bird species, as described in the appropriate assessment for Suffolk County Council's Suffolk Mineral Core Strategy, dated April 2007.](#)
- [To ensure the on-going favourable management of the sites, a management plan will need to be agreed with the landowner, Natural England and the RSPB, as has been for the existing area of restored heathland, and ensuring the positive impacts as listed in paragraph 2.6.](#)
