

## Suffolk County Council meeting Thursday 3 December 2020, vote taken on Motion 2

Motion 2 – Proposed by Councillor Elfrede Brambley-Crawshaw and seconded by Councillor Richard Rout.

This Council, which has declared a climate emergency and aims to be carbon neutral by 2030, acknowledges the importance of biodiversity to the climate and recognises that:

- 1. The planet is at a crossroads and action must be taken now to make space for nature to recover.
- 2. Nature is being destroyed at an unprecedented rate due to deforestation, over-fishing and destruction of wild areas. Wildlife populations have fallen by more than two-thirds in less than 50 years; there has been a 68% fall in over 20,000 different animal populations since 1970 (WWF, Zoological Society of London). Over 1.9 million square km of wild land has been lost since 2000 over eight times the size of the UK.
- 3. Urgent conservation action is needed, along with changes to the way we produce and consume food.
- 4. The destruction of natural spaces and species causes damage to human life. Factors believed to lead to the emergence of pandemics including habitat loss and the use and trade of wildlife are also some of the drivers behind the decline in wildlife. COVID-19 and lockdown have also shown how important nature and biodiversity is for mental wellbeing.

## Therefore, this Council resolves to:

- 1. Revise and update the 2015 Suffolk Nature Strategy to include a biodiversity strategy. Drawing on our Natural Capital Evidence Compendium (produced this year in partnership with Norfolk County Council and the University of East Anglia) the new strategy will set out how, with partners, we could increase Suffolk's biodiversity, halt the loss of habitats and species, and reintroduce declining species in suitable locations.
- 2. Investigate the creation of a Nature Recovery Partnership in the region to take forward this and other priorities.
- 3. Assess how Suffolk County Council can lead and guide partner organisations and stakeholders.
- 4. Continue to lead by example in the Council's use of its own land by adopting biodiversity-friendly land management practices where possible and practical.
- 5. Continue to look favourably upon any pilot proposals from partner organisations to improve and increase biodiversity.
- 6. Thank the County Council hosted Suffolk Biodiversity Information Service for providing a centre of expertise in the county and their work to help us improve ecological connectivity.
- 7. Write to the Secretary of State welcoming the Environment Bill, in particular Government amendments to enable Species Conservation Strategies and Protected Site Strategies, and asking what further support may be available to local authorities to enhance bio diversity within their areas.
