Youth Pledge for Employers



The Youth Pledge for Employers project (ESF Part Funded) is delivered across Norfolk and Suffolk, in partnership with The Mason Trust.

The project launched in June 2021 and will run until December 2023 and aims to engage with 420 SMEs across the counties. To date, the Business Connectors have registered over 180 employers and are supporting them to create into work inspiration (work experience, industry tours/talks, taster days, apprenticeships and employment with training) for 16-24 year olds.

The business connectors work collaboratively with the DWP, NALEP and the alternative provider network of projects supporting young people from NEET to EET.



Apprenticeships Suffolk

Apprenticeships Suffolk (ESF Part Funded) have engaged with

- 357 participants
- 233 businesses
- Supported 104 with apprenticeship opportunities and
- 43 apprenticeship starts.





The team continue to work collaboratively with the DWP, hotdesking in the Job Centre offices once a month in Lowestoft, central Ipswich, Bury St Edmunds, Mildenhall and Haverhill. This is now being extended to include training providers, attending to offer bespoke apprenticeship qualification IAG, which represents their training offer to claimants. Each training provider will use the opportunity to promote their own apprenticeship vacancies.

Apprenticeships Suffolk have launched their two pilot projects which are extensions of the main project:

- Pathway to Apprenticeships, which has been subcontracted and is being delivered by Inspire Suffolk and
- Sector Work Based Academy Programmes (SWAPS), which has been subcontracted and is being delivered by Steadfast Training.

The projects are aimed at participants who have been identified as requiring further support to be apprenticeship/work ready and wish to build on their skills to progress onto an apprenticeship opportunity, and supporting employers with their recruitment needs.

We continue to attend networking events such as the James Cartlidge MP's Employment and Skills Fair in Great Cornard and Way to Work Newmarket Jobs and Skills Fair to promote apprenticeships and the support we are offering.

Work Well Suffolk

The Work Well Suffolk Team (ESF part funded) have engaged with over 1,500 participants.

These figures include

- 201 over 50's,
- 95 from the BAME community and
- 74 from single parent households with childcare needs.

This is an excellent number considering the restrictions encountered over the past few years.

Currently, there have been

- 253 participants go into sustainable employment,
- 37 have ventured into self-employment and
- 500 participants have received Information, Advice and Guidance alongside their 1-1 coaching support.

The retention rate of participants on the project is 86% and there are currently 315 participants on programme.

Drop-in sessions are now regularly run from Suffolk Libraries and a number of Job Centres across the county which is proving impactful in these communities. Navigators are also attending Job Centres around the county to be accessible to those that are harder to reach.

Robyn has recently attended the James Cartlidge MP's Employment and Skills Fair in Great Cornard and the 'Way to Work' Newmarket Jobs and Skills Fair which provided various opportunities for the local community to gain support with employment, education and training and enabled us to spread the word of Work Well Suffolk via BBC Radio Suffolk!



Alan has been continuing his Job Clubs in Lowestoft,

Woodbridge and Framlingham Library with our participants and also attended a Lowestoft over 60's event.

Finally, Wendy has been meeting with new organisations e.g. Out Loud Music to explore new opportunities of supporting the local community and continuing to work locally in Ipswich libraries to offer continued support to those in need.

FUNDING & OPPORTUNITIES

Taking Teaching Further Fund Opens New Round

The Taking Teaching Further programme is a national initiative to attract experienced industry professionals with expert technical knowledge and skills to work in Further Education (FE).

The Department for Education-funded programme's long-term aims are to:

- Raise the profile and prestige of skilled FE teaching, particularly among industry professionals; and
- Increase the overall number of skilled technical teaching roles by helping providers to support experienced industry professionals with the training that they require to become FE teachers.

Round five will run until July 2024 and will continue to offer FE providers support with the funding towards new recruits undertaking a Level 5 teaching qualification, receiving intensive support such as paired teaching, mentoring or work shadowing, as well as a reduced teaching workload in the first year of teaching.

For this round, the programme has been expanded beyond the 15 technical routes to include a 'core skills' element, which aims to support the recruitment of business and industry experts to teach English, maths or SEND to Technical subject students.

There are two routes for application:

• Route 1 of the programme is open to all FE Colleges and Sixth Form Colleges in England.





• Route 2 of the programme is open to all independent training providers, employer led providers, third sector training providers, local authority providers, and adult and community learning providers.

Financial support is available for FE providers to address the cost of undertaking ITE and help create capacity for new recruits to learn and receive training and support on the job.

Funding of £18,200 per recruit will be made available.

▶ Round 5 is now open to applications. Recruitment to both strands will close on 15 December 2022.

Applications for the £3,000 incentive payment for hiring a new apprentice closes 20 May 2022



Do you work with employers who hired a new apprentice between 1 October 2021 and 31 January 2022? If these apprentices had an apprenticeship start date between 1 October 2021 and 31 March 2022, employers could be eligible for the £3,000 incentive payment for hiring a new apprentice. Applications close 20 May 2022. More information on:
