Feedback from the spring term ePEP quality assurance process

The spring term ePEPs were a reflection of the strong practice in place for our children. The Live Records and Provision tabs continue to be a real strength of the ePEPs and it has been a real pleasure to read about each child's experience of education and the impact of the support and interventions in place. Thank you.

If we could just highlight one area for the summer term – we know that lots of thought goes in to putting together the plan each term for each child. We would ask that all actions and decisions that shape the plan are recorded in the Planning and Pupil Voice tab. You can select a range of meeting options from the dropdown menu (e.g. PEP meeting, Transition meeting, Professionals meeting).

We recognise that some parts of the plan will be decided upon outside of formal meetings (for example, conversations between staff or with the child or their social worker) and these should also be recorded in the tab, using the *Actions/Decisions agreed outside of formal meeting* option in the dropdown menu.

To access the feedback on each ePEP, please go to the pupil's Document section and click to open the Word version of the spring term ePEP. It will open as a continuous document and the evaluation page will be just before the new summary page.

The submission date for summer ePEPs is Friday 5 July.

Primary Education: Tuesday 11 June

Our morning keynote speaker is Ruth Swales. Ruth has worked as a School Improvement Advisor, Inspector, Early Years Advisor, strategic lead and consultant in several Local Authorities and has a proven track record of supporting leaders and teachers to improve outcomes for children. Her second book, co-authored with Dr Aaron Bradbury, "A child-centred Early Years" will be published in September. She writes regularly for Early Years Educator and Yorkshire Bylines.

Ruth will be focusing upon how the curriculum can be used to support vulnerable learners.

Our afternoon speaker is Stephanie Fitzgerald. Stephanie is the founder of the award-winning DESTY emotional resilience programme (<https://www.educationdesty.com/>). She will be talking about building emotional resilience in the face of trauma.

Secondary Education: Wednesday 12 June

Our afternoon session will focus on 'Seeing potential, building futures'; how we can all help to prepare our children for life beyond school.
