Threshold Drop Information provided by Suffolk County Council

Update from Suffolk County Council

Paying for a place in a care home is an important consideration for customers before choosing their residential/nursing placement. Customers will pay for their place in your care home privately until their savings fall below £23,250. This is the amount the Government sets as the threshold for getting help towards the cost of care.

Their savings will normally include the value of property unless the Council ignore its value. They can apply to the Council to assess their eligibility for help with funding, if their savings fall below £23,250. As these assessment processes can take some time to complete it is recommended that customers start the process when their savings and capital are close to \pm 30,000.
