

Suffolk County Council meeting Thursday 22 May 2025, vote taken on Agenda Item 10 Motion 1 amendment.

Amendment – Proposed by Councillor Andrew Stringer and seconded by Councillor Robert Lindsay.

Motion Text:

'This council supports robust pre-application consultation for nationally significant infrastructure projects. In Suffolk, the unchecked surge of "clean energy" and transmission projects—sprawling solar and battery arrays and vast grid networks—strains our rural communities, farmland, and delicate ecosystems, causing significant local disruption.

The council strongly opposes the government's amendments to the Planning and Infrastructure Bill, which remove sections 42 and 49 of the Planning Act 2008, replacing statutory consultation with inadequate statutory guidance. These changes undermine fair engagement with Suffolk's residents, who face cumulative impacts from poorly coordinated energy schemes threatening the local economy, biodiversity, heritage, and quality of life.

The Council call on the government to urgently conclude a Land Use Framework Plan. The council reiterates its opposition to the government's 2030 grid decarbonisation target, which drives this relentless pace of development, prioritising arbitrary deadlines over thoughtful planning. It is the council's view that delays at pre-application arise from the volume of projects and applicants' often substandard engagement, not excessive regulation. Weakening the consultation process risks approving flawed developments that disregard Suffolk's unique environmental and social needs.

The council urges the government to:

- 1. Retain sections 42 and 49 of the Planning Act 2008, or
- 2. Enforce case-by-case statutory engagement criteria, rigorously assessing applicants' consultation quality.

Without these safeguards, the proposals will fuel distrust and enable harmful energy projects to proceed. Suffolk demands a planning process that balances broader goals with our residents' wellbeing, landscapes, and economy, ensuring infrastructure respects the communities it impacts.'
