

Suffolk County Council meeting Thursday 10 July 2025, vote taken on Motion 1.

Motion 1 – Proposed by Councillor Richard Smith MVO and seconded by Councillor Lance Stanbury.

Motion Text:

This Council expresses its huge disappointment at the announcements on the future funding of Local Government, following the conclusions of the government's Spending Review.

It notes that the government proposes no short or medium-term end to the funding problems experienced across our sector, and that the very severe implications of SEND spending remain unresolved, with any action being postponed for a further two years.

This Council deplores much of the tone of the government's announcements, especially that the maximum rise possible (without a referendum) in Council Tax will be expected. This will subject Suffolk's Council Tax payers to future rises of five per cent, probably double the prevailing rate of inflation, meaning that Council Tax will double in just thirteen years.

The Council recognises, that as a rural area, Suffolk is already feeling the strain of recent government announcements. Its businesses are struggling with new National Insurance liabilities, our agricultural community is concerned over the future of family farms due to the changes to Agricultural Property Relief, the stark issue of rural deprivation continues to go unrecognised by government, and an ageing population is seeing increased pressure placed on Adult Social Care. Further, regional infrastructure investment – such as the much-needed upgrade of Ely junction which has a benefit to cost ratio of 4.89 to 1– continues to go undelivered.

It is the view of this Council that Suffolk deserves fairer funding and the government's Spending Review does nothing to recognise this. Instead it just increases the burden on local council tax payers.

The Council asks its Leader to write to the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government to raise the issues contained in this motion and to copy this letter to the Chancellor of the Exchequer.'
