I hope the minutes are now OK [REDACTED] will be sending them out to everyone and any comments from the residents on the minutes will be dealt with in the next meeting.

Also I see a second billboard sized advert for TRU has appeared next to the A12 at the junction with the Kesgrave Road. I did mention the first one to you at the last meeting and you said it had been given permission by district, but I see that we were at cross purposes. You were talking about the signs at the entrance to TRU (which do have permission) and I was talking about the billboard on the A12. Someone may have put these up thinking that they are allowed under The Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007 Schedule 1, Class B - "An advertisement displayed on or in a vehicle normally employed as a moving vehicle." But there is a limitation in that "The vehicle is not used principally for the display of advertisements." It is a common misconception that putting a billboard on wheels makes the advert acceptable under Class B but as it is being used principally for the display of the advert that is not the case.
