Taking GCSEs while Home Educated

Home educated students sit exams as external/private candidates at a registered exam centre accredited by their chosen exam board.

The GCSE Exam Boards in England & Wales are AQA, OCR, Pearson (Edexcel) and Edugas / WJEC. The iGCSE Exam Boards are Pearson (Edexcel), Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) and AQA (called AQA Certificate).

Each exam board provides a syllabus and subject specification.

Exam centres can be difficult to find; contacting local high schools (especially one previously attended) may help. Some independent schools also accept external candidates. You can also approach Unity Schools Partnership and https://www.unitysp.co.uk/ and Thomas Gainsborough School https://www.tgschool.net/

As an external (private) candidate, you must pay all associated costs - including study materials, registration, and exam fees. Costs vary by centre and location. Arrangements should be made by early November to avoid extra fees and secure a place.

Building this fireplace was something for Vince (8), Elliott (15) and Victor (8) to be proud of.










poem about a sea cow
