What is an AANT?

AANT stands for Analysis of Additional Needs Tool and it **all happens online**. This makes it rapid and effective: providing support for many children and young people.

The AANT **provides a detailed, personalised action plan**, giving school an early opportunity to talk about your child with an experienced Educational Psychologist. Together they can discuss anything that you or school have noticed about your child's strengths, difficulties and needs.



What do I need to do?

Before your child can benefit from the AANT, you or another responsible adult **will need to give your permission**.

You will receive an email from AANT.online, and you'll be asked to click a link in the email to AANT.online where you can give your consent, and share your thoughts.
