








# Am I eligible for COVID-19 vaccine, testing and care?



#### Introduction



During the COVID-19 pandemic, everyone in the UK is eligible for help and support.



No one will be charged for testing, treatment or for a vaccine.



This includes anyone living in the UK without permission.

#### Introduction



No one will be charged for:



Testing for COVID-19, even if the test shows you do not have COVID-19.



Treatment for COVID-19.



A COVID-19 vaccine.

The NHS is running the vaccination programme and it is a free service.

#### Will there be any immigration checks?



No immigration checks are needed if you are only tested, treated or vaccinated for COVID-19.


## What if I'm not registered with a GP?

#### Can I access testing if I don't have any symptoms?



Yes, you can access COVID-19 testing if you don't have any symptoms.



1 in 3 people with COVID-19 do not show any symptoms.



Through testing we can stop the spread of the virus to other people.



There are different tests you can get to check if you have COVID-19.

Wear a face covering over nose and mouth when indoors.

Stay 2 metres apart from people you do not live with where possible
