



Self-isolation support payments



If you are on a low income and are unable to work because you have been told by NHS Test and Trace that you have to self-isolate, you may be eligible for a payment of £500.



This is as part of the Government's Test and Trace Support Payment scheme.

To be eligible for a payment you must:



To be eligible for a self-isolation payment, you must be able to answer YES to the statements in the blue boxes on the next page:



1. I have been told to self-isolate by NHS
Test & Trace because I have tested positive
for Covid-19 or been in close contact with
someone who has.



2. I am employed or self-employed.



3. I am unable to work from home and will lose income if I don't go into work.



4. My partner or I recieve benefits.

For example Universal Credit or Housing Benefit.

You may be eligible for a different payment instead if:



You may be able to access another type of financial support.

This is called a 'discretionary fund payment'.



To be eligible for a self-isolation payment, you must be able to answer YES to the statements in the yellow boxes:



I have been told to self-isolate by NHS Test & Trace because I have tested positive for Covid-19 or been in close contact with someone who has.



I am employed or self-employed.



I am unable to work from home and will lose income if I don't go into work.



I am not receiving an eligible benefit such as Universal Credit or Housing Benefit.



(If you live alone) I earn earn less than £19,200 a year.

(If you live with a partner) **Together, we earn** less £37,400 a year.



I have less than £3,000 in savings.

How to apply



To apply for a self-isolation support payment, please complete the online application form from your local Council.



This is the Council you pay your council tax to.

Search 'Isolation Support Payment' and the name of the council you pay your council tax to.



Applications must be made within 28 days after the first day of your period of self-isolation.

The scheme is currently open until the:

31st March 2021

What will I need when making an application?



 Notification from NHS Test and Trace asking you to self-isolate (this will include an ID number)



a bank statement confirming your name and address



 proof of employment. If you are self-employed you will need to show evidence of your income.





You will also need to show that your business delivers services which cannot be done without contact with people.

How will payments be made?



Payments will be made by bank transfer to your bank account.
