Find someone to sponsor

You may already have a known contact you wish to sponsor. If this is the case, go to step **3**. If not, a potential match could be facilitated via a charity such as **resetuk.org**

Sponsor info sent to Suffolk County Council

Once you are matched with a Ukrainian citizen or family, and the visa application is underway, the Home Office passes sponsor and refugee guest information to Suffolk County Council.

All Ukrainian guests must apply for a visa via gov.uk (gov.uk/guidance/ apply-for-a-visa-under-the-ukrainesponsorship-scheme) or you may do this for them. Criminal record checks (DBS) do not need to be undertaken before visas are issued – see step 5.



Suffolk County Council will call you to gather some initial information about your home and the people who live there with you; including information for the online DBS application process via Community Action Suffolk. A criminal record check (DBS) is also required for all sponsors under the Homes for Ukraine scheme.

Your district or borough council contacts you to arrange a home visit to undertake accommodation checks. Verifying your ID for the DBS will be part of the home visit process.
