

- **2.6 OS Grid Reference:** 586,332 240,732
- **2.7 Extent of flooding:** One property flooded internally on multiple occasions resulting in damage to property and its contents.
- 2.8 Effect of flooding: Flooding to entrance hallway
- 2.9 History: Previously flooded property approx. 12-15 years ago
- 2.10 Flooding Source: Surface water due to significant rainfall event
- 2.11 Likely Causes:
 - Significant rainfall event (no rainfall data available)
 - Ponding of water on the public highway
 - Blocked surface water drainage outfall
 - Unmaintained watercourse

2.12 Additional Information:

• Property is 400 years old



• Area is predicted to be affected by surface water flooding during significant rainfall events
