

- **2.6 OS Grid Reference**: 605174, 272350
- **2.7 Extent of flooding:** One property flooded internally on multiple occasions resulting in damage to property and its contents.
- 2.8 Effect of flooding: Internal flooding & flooding of public highway
- **2.9 History:** 2004, May 2013 affecting property and public highway
- **2.10 Flooding Source:** Surface water
- **2.11 Likely causes:** Significant rainfall, saturated soils, restrictions in highway drainage, unmaintained watercourse, and possible restrictions in culverted watercourse
- **2.12 Additional Information:** Property pre dates 1880's. Suffolk has had significant rainfall during December 2020 resulting in saturated soils and watercourses that are unable to drain away.

- 2. Suffolk County Council, Lead Local Flood Authority to send advisory letters to riparian owners informing them of their rights and responsibilities with regard to watercourses that run through or adjacent to their land.
- 3. Homeowner should consider what flood mitigation measures can be installed on their property to mitigate the effects of flooding.
