

**SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (BOROUGH OF IPSWICH) (STOPPING, WAITING AND
LOADING PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS AND ON-STREET PARKING PLACES)
(CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2019 (IPSWICH) (TOWN CENTRE) (PROHIBITION AND
RESTRICTION OF WAITING) (VARIATION NO.33) ORDER 202-**

Suffolk County Council proposes to make the above order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which would substitute revision 2 of Map Tile GJ122 and GK122 as amended, in place of revision 1 of the same Map Tile and revision 3 of Map Tile GK123 and GL123 as amended, in place of revision 2 of the same Map Tile into the above-named 2019 order and Schedule 7 of the 2019 Order shall be amended accordingly. The effect of the order will be to introduce:

No waiting at any time and No loading 11am to 4.30pm any day on:

- Butter Market (Z5U1010), Ipswich.
- Carr Street (Z5U1058), Ipswich.
- Cornhill (Z5U1060), Ipswich.
- Dial Lane (Z5U1011), Ipswich.
- Lady Lane (Heavy Duty Footway), Ipswich.
- Lion Street (Z5U1014), Ipswich from its junctions with Cornhill to a point approximately 24 metres north of its junction with King Street (southern side of Lion Street) and 30 metres north of its junctions with King Street (northern side of Lion Street).
- Lloyds Avenue (Z5U1002), Ipswich from its junction with Cornhill to a point approximately 25 metres north of its junction with Cornhill.
- Princes Street (Z5U1069), Ipswich from its junction with Cornhill to its junction with King Street.
- Providence Street (Z5U1003), Ipswich.
- St Lawrence Street (Z5U1009), Ipswich.
- Tavern Street (Z5U1059), Ipswich.
- Thoroughfare (Heavy Duty Footway), Ipswich from its junction with Princes Street to a point approximately 27 metres east of its junction with Princes Street and from its junction with Cornhill to point approximately 36 metres south of its junction with Cornhill (to join with the first section specified).
- Tower Street (Z5U1004), Ipswich between its junction with Tavern Street at a point of 39 metres north of its junction with Tavern Street.
- Westgate Street (Z5U1061), Ipswich.
- Cox Lane (UZU1008), Ipswich from its junction with Carr Street to a point 42 metres south of its junction with Carr Street.
- Hatton Court (Pedestrian Way), Ipswich from Tavern Street and Tower Church Yard.
- St. Stephens Lane (Z5U1013), Ipswich from the Buttermarket in a southerly direction for 29 metres.

No waiting at any time and No loading at any time:

- Wingfield Street (Z5U1028), Ipswich from Tacket Street in a southerly direction for 43 metres.

No waiting at any time and No loading 8am to 11am and 4.30pm to 6pm from Monday to Saturday (blue badge holders 11am to 4.30pm from Monday to Saturday 3 hours max stay):

- Tower Street (Z5U1004) (East), Ipswich. 2 bays running parallel to Church wall opposite property No 13-17 Tower Street. First bay opposite No 13 starts 106 metres south of the junction with Tower Ramparts for 5.5 metres. Second bay opposite No 15 – 17 starts from 76 metres south of the junction with Tower Ramparts for 24 metres.

Exemptions to the waiting restrictions allow a vehicle to wait for so long as is necessary to board or alight or to load and unload; for building, industrial or demolition works; for the maintenance of the road or its services; and for fulfilling statutory duties. There are the usual exemptions for blue badge-holders.

Suffolk County Council previously consulted on this proposal between 19 January 2024 and 9 February 2024. Any representations received during the initial consultation will still be considered at the end of the current consultation period.

A copy of the draft order and plans showing the road affected, together with a copy of the Council's reasons for this proposal, may be seen with advance notice at the address below, 9.00 a.m. – 5.00 p.m. Monday – Friday; also at County Library, Northgate Street, Ipswich, IP1 3DE, 9am – 6pm Monday; 9am - 7pm Tuesday; 9am- 6pm Wednesday and Thursday; 9am - 7pm Friday; 8:30am - 5pm Saturday; and 10am - 4pm Sunday.

Please bear in mind that any such correspondence cannot be regarded as confidential and may be inspected by any interested party.
