

School Nursing

What do School Nurses do?

School Nurses help children and young people stay:

- Healthy
- Safe
- Happy

They can support with:

- Physical health
- Feelings and mental health
- Additional needs
- Sexual Health
- Big changes, like moving to a new school

What is changing?

The School Nursing Service will move away from a system where support is mainly provided after a referral is made. Instead, School Nurses will spend more time:

- Preventing problems before they get bigger
- Supporting schools
- Helping children and young people who need it most



What support will still be available?

For everyone:

- School drop-in sessions
- Parent online drop-in sessions
- Advice and information

For children who need extra help:

- Support with health concerns
- Small group sessions
- Short one-to-one support

What about children with special educational needs and a disability (SEND)?

Children and young people with SEND will still be able to get support. Adjustments will be made to help them access the service.

What if I need help?

There will be:

- Information and advice available online 24/7
- Help to find the right service if School Nursing is not the best place for support
