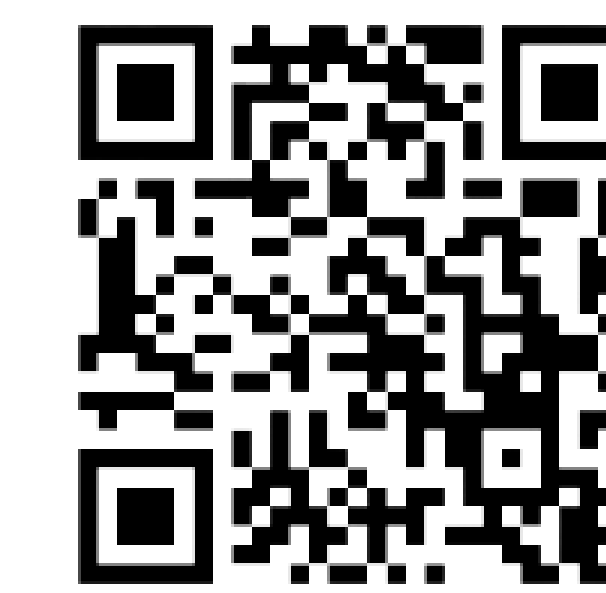

We were able to paint an excellent picture around needs & what forms of support will be needed to enable this student to be successful. I can't put into words how excited our team have been over your last couple of visits for our students. This has also allowed us as a school to go through what is possible as a mainstream school when discussing what may potentially go inside the plan. Fingers crossed this continues!

I feel that this will help improve the quality of the EHCPs that are written. Schools and families will have more faith in how thorough the process is and this will help them to feel confident in what they are implementing will have a positive impact on the CYP.
