Suffolk County Council Homes for Ukraine, welcomed the news in the Autumn Statement update from the Chancellor of the Exchequer that 'Thank you' payments will be extended from **March 2024 to March 2025**, completing a third year of support for hosts.

A word from St Elizabeth Hospice

Volunteer Connect Project

St Elizabeth Hospice Volunteer Connect Project is committed to providing supportive Volunteering opportunities to refugees and asylum seekers in Ipswich and East Suffolk through partnership working with local grassroots organisations and community hubs.

Volunteering can be a great way to meet people in the local community and can support wellbeing. Through volunteering, refugees and asylum seekers bring unique and valuable skills and experiences to the hospice.

If you are not able to work, volunteering can give you useful experience and help build your confidence. St Elizabeth Hospice can also provide Voluntary Work Placements for Level 3 ESOL students at Suffolk New College.

If needed, the hospice can provide funded ESOL lessons through lpswich Community Media. Some volunteering roles come with the opportunity to gain a qualification such as Food Hygiene Levels 1 and 2. St Elizabeth Hospice's Compassionate Conversations Training

As part of the Volunteer Connect project, the hospice has been working alongside the people and organisations in our community to develop and translate Compassionate Conversations training sessions.

Compassionate conversations is aimed at helping people (aged 18+) build the skills and confidence to enable open, honest and sensitive conversations around end of life, loss

and bereavement, whilst identifying ways to help and support each other in the Community. Being able to talk with and comfort people who are experiencing end of life, loss or bereavement can be a daunting prospect - but it needn't be that way.

The hospice has recently worked with the Polish Community Hub, who very kindly translated the Compassionate Conversations Power point presentation into Polish and also helped to develop the content so that it fitted in with Polish beliefs and values. The Hospice delivered the session in English alongside a Polish Translator and presented with our translated power point - any videos included Polish Subtitles. The aim is to make these sessions available in as many different languages as possible, whilst also learning about all the different traditions, ritual and beliefs that are held by the communities around us.

St Elizabeth Hospice improves life for people living with progressive and life-limiting illnesses. Our work is centred around individual needs. We provide specialist support wherever it is needed, in people's homes, in the community or at our hospice and costs £12.9 million per year to run, 30% is funded by NHS, the remaining 70% is raised through donations or fundraising. Volunteers are vital to the successful running of the hospice, we currently have over 1500 volunteers!

18 Month Checks

Suffolk County Council Homes for Ukraine Casework team have been visiting guests as part of our 18-month welfare and safety checks since the beginning of November, so far 144 guests have been visited. During these meetings we have been working with hosts and guests to promote applications to our independent living payment offer where this is suitable and have had some great feedback about resolving issues which needed to be overcome by both hosts and guests. This feedback will assist us in planning the support we are offering guests and hosts over the coming months.

In early January 2024 the Homes for Ukraine Team will begin contacting hosts who have been sponsoring a Ukrainian guest(s) for 18 months. A questionnaire will be sent

via email with a request that this is completed and returned to us, so we can ensure we offer support where it is needed.

Stand With Ukraine

Suffolk County Council Homes for Ukraine visited the 'Stand with Ukraine' gathering, on Angel Hill in Bury St Edmunds on Saturday, the 25th of November. A lovely group of local guests, hosts and supporters meet once a month to highlight the ongoing plight of the Ukrainians and the war in their home country.

The Homes for Ukraine team are happy to attend events where possible, which show the ongoing support provided by the Suffolk Community and encourage new hosts to step forward. HOW YOU CAN HELP

Guests leaving host properties

It remains the host's responsibility to inform the Homes for Ukraine Team of the date their guests left their property. This should be the last night that the guest spent in the property.

Case studies

This month we would like to highlight a case study from Ormiston Academy, Sudbury which highlights the support put in place for the Ukrainian students, as well as the support the Ukrainian students received from their peers and wider community to help them settle into Suffolk.

Ormiston Academy, Sudbury

In the autumn term of 2022, 7 Ukrainian students joined the pupils at Ormiston Sudbury Academy.

They were from different parts of Ukraine, none had any English Language skills, and all had experienced various degrees of trauma and disadvantage due to the war in Ukraine.

Ormiston Sudbury Academy had to learn quickly to support not only their academic opportunities, but also support their Pastoral and Mental Health needs to ensure that the students settled in quickly but also that they had any extra support they needed to

reach and succeed in their academic goals.

As an academy, led by one of our Pastoral Managers, we established a weekly Ukrainian breakfast - an opportunity for all of the students to meet up, discuss their positives and concerns and collectively support each other in their native language whilst giving them English breakfast delicacies!

We established a number of support structures to support our students, including:

- o All PowerPoints to include Ukrainian subtitles
- o All worksheets and instructions translated into Ukrainian
- o Flash Academy English lessons in native language
- o EAL group sessions
- o 1:1 academic tutoring through MyTutor

A positive example is of one refugee from Ukraine, who joined the school and as many do, had an excellent work ethic and strong academic aspirations, he was able to benefit so well from the extra support and measures put in place that he passed all of his GCSE's, was accepted into a place in 6th form and was welcomed into the school community so well that he was voted Prom King!

Could you help a family in need?



In February 2022, the UK was asked to help support Ukrainians displaced by the war.

Since then, the people of Suffolk have welcomed more than 1,400 Ukrainian Refugees into their homes.

Unfortunately, the war continues and we still need hosts to offer a safe place to stay for individuals and families in Suffolk.

Can you help?

Homes for Ukraine Suffolk still need safe and secure places in the larger villages and towns, with good access to public transport and amenities.

If you can offer a safe place for a Ukrainian guest, please email <u>refugeesupport@suffolk.gov.uk</u> or visit our website <u>www.suffolk.gov.uk/Ukraine</u> and to express your interest by completing <u>the online form</u>.

Accommodation must be available for at least 6 months and be fit for purpose.

If you sign up to the scheme and all checks are completed, you will be eligible for a monthly £350 'Thank you' payment, rising to £500 per month once your guests have been in the UK for more than 12 months or you have hosted for over 6 months.
