## Seasonal Winter 'Thank you' payment

Suffolk County Council is offering a one-off additional payment of £315 to all hosts who are accommodating Ukrainian guests in January, as recognition of the additional pressures faced during our coldest months.

This payment will be made in February to those hosting Ukrainian guests during January 2024 and is in addition to the monthly payment already paid to active hosts on this scheme.

If hosts wish to opt out of receiving the additional payment, they can do so by contacting refugeesupport@suffolk.gov.uk by 31st January 2024.

#### **Independent Living Payment**

The Independent Living Payment was set up by Suffolk County Council to support guests to prepare for living independently after leaving their hosts accommodation.

A reminder of the criteria is below and if a guest has any questions in regard to this or their eligibility, they can contact the Homes for Ukraine team at <a href="mailto:refugeesupport@suffolk.gov.uk">refugeesupport@suffolk.gov.uk</a>

• Guests/applicants must be moving directly from their Suffolk host or sponsor into their first independent housing property after the 1st of April 2023. (tenancy agreements dated before this date are not eligible)

- Guests must be registered on the Suffolk Homes for Ukraine sponsorship scheme.
- Guests/Applicants must have been living with a sponsor or host under the Suffolk Homes for Ukraine scheme for a minimum of two months.
- Guests/Applicants must hold a valid, current UK bank account in their own name. (applications which do not match the bank details will not be eligible)
- Guests/Applicants must provide a signed, correctly dated and current tenancy agreement for the address they are claiming for in the name of the applicant.
- The tenancy agreement must be attached to the application and be for a minimum of 6 months.
- Only one claim can be made per new household moving into independent living accommodation.
- The Independent Living Payment Application form must be completed in full, with the claimants' details, must be signed and dated and the tenancy agreement must be attached in full.
- Claimants must not have made a previous claim for the Independent Living Payment (only one claim per guest will be eligible)

#### Could you help a family in need?



In February 2022, the UK was asked to help support Ukrainians displaced by the war.

Since then, the people of Suffolk have welcomed more than 1,400 Ukrainian Refugees into their homes.

Unfortunately, the war continues and we still need hosts to offer a safe place to stay for individuals and families in Suffolk.

#### Can you help?

Homes for Ukraine Suffolk still need safe and secure places in the larger villages and towns, with good access to public transport and amenities.

If you can offer a safe place for a Ukrainian guest, please email <u>refugeesupport@suffolk.gov.uk</u> or visit our website <u>www.suffolk.gov.uk/Ukraine</u> and to express your interest by completing <u>the online form</u>.

Accommodation must be available for at least 6 months and be fit for purpose.

If you sign up to the scheme and all checks are completed, you will be eligible for a monthly £350 'Thank you' payment, rising to £500 per month once your guests have been in the UK for more than 12 months or you have hosted for over 6 months.
