During the day we can support you on a 1:1 basis with housing applications & advice and offer a range of advice around employment & planning. Together, we will offer refreshments, general support and signposting, employment and benefit advice, Independent Living Payments, other move-on grants, a summer programme of Suffolk Tours, Community Hubs and English Conversation classes.

Initial, 4 month and 10 month welfare checks

At regular stages of guests staying with hosts, the Homes for Ukraine team are required to complete welfare checks – these happen at the initial stage (within two weeks of arrival) between 4 and 6 months, and again between 10 and 12 months. We will also complete further checks through the next year where appropriate.

It is imperative that we do these checks to ensure that any support needs are identified, and the welfare of both guest and host are met. The checks are also part of the specific conditions that the government set out and must be completed for the 'thank you' payments to continue.

If you or your guest have been contacted by our team, please reply, (this will be from the regugeesupport@suffolk.gov.uk) and encourage your guest to arrange a meeting with one of our casework team as soon as possible.

Changes of circumstances or guest departures

Hosts are reminded that they are required to let the Homes for Ukraine team know when there are any changes in the hosting situation, in particular if your guest is leaving the property for more than four weeks. This is to ensure the continued welfare of the guests and that no over payments are made. It is important that we keep all our records up to date and are aware of the location of all guests to ensure their support and welfare needs are met.

Guidance around DBS checks

When you apply to become a Host on the Homes for Ukraine programme, Suffolk County Council is required to do a DBS check of all adults over 16 in your household, even if you

have an existing certificate.

The process for this is as follows:

- You will receive a call from Suffolk County Council to gather some initial
 information, including how many people over 16 years live in the host household.
 We aim to make this call within 2 working days of receiving your information.
- 2. You will then receive an email from the Community Action Suffolk DBS Service asking you to complete an online DBS checking form.
- 3. You will be contacted by Suffolk County Council to make an appointment to attend a local library so that your ID documents can be verified.

At present, Suffolk County Council is only applying for DBS checks for new hosts, people who have recently joined a household, or people who have recently turned 16.

DBS Check renewals

SCC may need to renew DBS checks for existing hosts in the future. When a DBS check needs renewing, we will contact you. Any correspondence will be from an official Suffolk County Council email address; refugee.support@suffolk.gov.uk

Any DBS Check renewal for the Homes for Ukraine Scheme will be paid for by Suffolk County Council as with the original check. You will not be charged to renew your DBS check.

Be vigilant when giving payment details

In order to make payments to hosts, Suffolk County Council will get in touch to request your bank account number and sort code. This is the only information we will ask for. We will clearly explain who is calling and what information we need.

Never give your bank account details to someone you do not know.

Reminder: Support for Ukrainian refugees moving to private rented accommodation

In May, Suffolk County Council announced a one-off £2,000 support grant for Ukrainian refugees moving on from their host into their own accommodation.

The Independent Living Payment is available to any Ukrainian Refugees, moving into private rented accommodation after 1 April 2023. Guests must have been living in Suffolk for a minimum of two months and be registered on the Suffolk Homes for Ukraine scheme to be eligible for the payment.

The funding can be used for any associated housing costs, including furniture, moving costs or travel to work. The support can be used towards accommodation which is furnished or unfurnished, and accommodation can be in Suffolk or out of county.

Ukrainian guests can apply for the Independent Living Payment by visiting https://www.suffolk.gov.uk/community-and-safety/communities/community-engagement/support-for-refugees/support-for-ukraine/ukraine-information-for-guests and completing the application form.

Please note that applicants must provide a copy of their tenancy agreement for the property they are claiming for, in order to receive the support.



Could you help a family in need?



We need new hosts to support Ukrainian guests who have been in the UK for 6 months or more, but are not ready to move to independent private rented accommodation.

We are particularly in need of new hosts who live in Ipswich, Bury St Edmunds or Lowestoft.
