## SUFFOLK'S RESPONSE



### **Suffolk Homes For Ukraine Team Supports Samaritan Purse - Operation Christmas Child**

The Homes for Ukraine Team at Suffolk County Council decided that instead of giving cards and gifts to each other for Christmas we would participate in Operation Christmas Child. We were able to fill four shoe boxes, to give to children.

Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse. It is a hands-on way to bless children in need across the world by filling shoeboxes with toys, personal care items, school supplies, and fun gifts.

The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate our love in a tangible way to children in need around the world. We know that our shoeboxes bought joy to children who received them at Christmas.

### **Seasonal Winter 'Thank you' payment.**

Suffolk County Council is offering a one-off additional payment of £350 to all hosts who are accommodating Ukrainian guests in January 2026, as recognition of the additional pressures faced during our coldest months.

This payment will be made in February to those hosting Ukrainian guests during January

2026 and is in addition to the monthly payment already paid to active hosts on this scheme.

You do not need to make a claim for this payment. An email will be sent to eligible hosts, advising they will receive the payment and giving the option to opt out if they choose.

### **Looking to the Future – Supporting your guests into independent living**

To support guests still in sponsorship as they transition to living independently, the government have extended thank you payments for 18 months of the Ukraine Permission Extension (UPE) scheme at a rate of £350 a month.

We know things are difficult for many households and, while you cannot be charging your guests rent and receive Thank You payments, you may decide to ask your adult guests to contribute something reasonable towards household bills.

All Ukrainian adults arriving under the Homes for Ukraine scheme and holders of UPE visas are eligible to work here and have the right to receive benefits while they are in the UK.

We encourage you to have a conversation with your guest/s about their next steps and work with them to develop a plan for their future.

If you would like to continue to support your guests in the long term, you could move to a more formal arrangement, for example, by renting a room in your home through the Government's 'Rent a Room' scheme. Or you may wish to rent another property that you own to your guest.

This would mean that you may need to become a landlord, which could require you to take on more responsibilities, and if you charge rent you won't be entitled to claim a Thank You payment as well.

Your rights and responsibilities could be different depending on whether the guest remains living in your property or moves into another property you own. ### **Ukraine Permission Extension Scheme – (UPES): A Guide for Ukrainians in the UK**

The UK Government has introduced the Ukraine Permission Extension scheme (UPES). The scheme allows people currently living in the UK under an existing Ukraine Visa scheme to apply to extend their stay in the UK for a further 18 months when their valid Ukrainian visa expires.

The Ukraine Permission Extension Scheme (UPES) **is now open for applications.**

It is free to apply for the UPE scheme, and if an application is successful, your guests will be able to continue to live, work and study in the UK and access public funds.

It is important that your guests actively apply to extend their visa. (Please note – visas will NOT be extended automatically)

#### **How and when to apply?**

- Your guests should submit an application when they have 28 days or less left on their current permission.
- If your guest applies too early, their application may be rejected and would then need to reapply when their current permission has 28 days or less remaining.
- If your guest doesn't know the date when their current leave to remain ends, they can sign into their [UKVI account](#) to find out or refer to their permission letter to verify the visa's expiry date.
- Applications can only be submitted while your guests are physically present in the UK.

**Please note**

- Your guests should not leave the UK while their UPE application is being processed. Leaving the country will result in the cancellation of an application.
- Transitioning to an e-Visa is not the same as extending a visa under the UPE.

**Host Thank You Payments – Ukraine Permission Extension scheme**

To support guests still in sponsorship as they transition to living independently, the government have extended thank you payments for 18 months of the Ukraine Permission Extension (UPE) scheme at a rate of £350 a month.

When your guest(s) Homes for Ukraine permission expiry is reached, a new claim form and declaration for the Ukraine Permission Extension scheme will be sent to the lead host.

Please complete and submit this form if you wish to receive thank you payments.

**Payments for eligible UPE claims will be at the government rate of £350 per month.**  
**Please note - SCC will NOT be providing an uplift to the government flat rate.**

## **Independent Living Payment**

Suffolk County Council is offering a one-off Independent Living Payment (ILP) of £2,000 to Homes for Ukraine guests who are leaving their host accommodation and moving into their own home. To issue this payment certain criteria must be met, and Suffolk County Council will ask to see a copy of a valid, signed and dated (by both parties) legal tenancy agreement in the guest's name.

The funding can be used for purchasing items to support the move to independent accommodation. The new accommodation can be either furnished or unfurnished and can be situated outside of Suffolk.

## **NATIONAL UPDATES**

### **Council Tax Exemption– Ukraine Permission Extension**

Ukraine Permission Extension Visa Holders are disregarded for the purpose of council tax **only** if they live in accommodation provided by a sponsor/host who is entitled to thank you payments under Ukraine Permission Extension, and they previously held a Homes for Ukraine visa.

**Please note if your guest(s) have extended their visas under the Ukraine Permission Extension Scheme and are moving into independent accommodation they will no**

**longer be exempted from paying Council Tax.**

### **Other Exemptions and Disregards under Ukraine Permission Extension**

**Income Tax:** Thank you payments made in respect of UPE guests will continue to be disregarded from income tax calculations.

**Benefits:** Thank you payments made in respect of UPE guests will continue to be disregarded from benefits calculations.

**Property tax:** Annual Tax on Enveloped Dwelling (ATED): Those hosting UPE guests in a dwelling normally subject to ATED will continue to be exempt.

**Stamp Duty Land Tax (SDLT):** Those hosting UPE guests will continue to benefit from relief from the 15% stamp duty rate, which is usually payable on properties owned by a company, a partnership with corporate members, or a collective investment scheme.

### **Second Homes for Ukraine Visas**

The Ukraine Permission Extension (UPE) is an in-country visa route: [Those who wish to apply can only do so from the UK and must stay in the UK whilst awaiting a decision.](#)

Homes For Ukraine visa holders who need to leave the UK for an emergency or work reasons cannot apply to UPE. They are however eligible to apply for a second Homes For Ukraine visa.

Any Homes For Ukraine visa holder could apply for a second visa. This will be granted if the immigration conditions are met, including having an approved Sponsor.

### **E-Visa Update**

If your guest makes a successful application to travel to the UK after 30 October 2025, guests may not be issued with a vignette. Instead, they will need to access their e-Visa through their UKVI account to see the permission they have been granted before they travel to the UK.

For information, from 1 September 2025, charities and voluntary organisations across the UK are being funded to provide free help and information to vulnerable people who need to create a UKVI account and access their e-Visa that may assist guests who are in the UK. ### **Aligning a child's Ukraine Permission Extension (UPE) with a parent or legal guardian**

Since the launch of UPE, children who apply with their parent will have their period of permission aligned to their parent. As of 11 November 2025, the immigration rules were changed so that a child's permission may also be aligned to that of a legal guardian. The adult (parent or legal guardian) must be in the UK for a child's permission to be aligned. ## **UK museums are rethinking their approaches to Ukrainian cultural heritage**

Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022 has brought a sharper focus on the long-standing historical forces that have sought to marginalise, overwrite, or appropriate Ukrainian identity.

The assaults on historic cities, museums, archives, and sacred sites have put renewed attention on persistent patterns of erasure or appropriation.

This moment has also increased awareness of how inherited narratives, older hierarchies and unquestioned assumptions have shaped our understanding and interpretation of collections from Ukraine and Eastern Europe more broadly.

This re-examination is happening in the context of a wider shift within the UK museum sector, driven in part by decolonial approaches that challenge established interpretive hierarchies and highlight the political forces embedded in museum practice.



**What is therapy?**

**What can our therapy service support you with?**  
Our therapist will listen to you and explore your feelings and experiences in a safe space, without fear of judgement. It is a chance to discuss any difficulty or distress you may be experiencing or have experienced in the past.

They can help you to accept the things that you cannot change and help you to bring about the changes that are possible.

**How can I access this therapy support?**  
If you would like therapeutic support, you can contact our Helpline service by telephone on our freephone number **0808 156 9877** or you can email [RefugeeFamilyHelpline@barnardos.org.uk](mailto:RefugeeFamilyHelpline@barnardos.org.uk)

When you contact our Helpline our friendly Advisors will listen to you to learn and understand more about your situation.

With your agreement our Advisor will refer you to our therapeutic support service.

The therapist will then make contact with you in within approximately 2-4 weeks at a date and time that is convenient for you to begin sessions.

Whilst you are being supported by our therapy team, you can continue to contact our Helpline Advisors who will be happy to offer you any additional support that you may require.

**How do I know if I could benefit from support?**  
If you are feeling low, lonely, stuck, hopeless, feel like you need someone to talk to or listen to you, then therapy may be for you.

We can support children and young people aged 21 and under who have settled in England on one of the following schemes;

Afghan Citizens Resettlement Scheme (Pathways 1, 2 and 3)

## Could you help a family in need?

In February 2022, the UK was asked to help support Ukrainians displaced by the war. Since then, the people of Suffolk have welcomed more than 1,700 Ukrainian Refugees into their homes.

Unfortunately, the war continues, and we still need hosts to offer a safe place to stay for individuals and families in Suffolk.

Can you help? Homes for Ukraine Suffolk still need safe and secure places in the larger villages and towns, with good access to public transport and amenities.

If you can offer a safe place for a Ukrainian guest, please visit [Homes for Ukraine: record your interest](#) to express your interest by completing the online form. Accommodation must be available for at least 6 months and be fit for purpose.

If you sign up to the scheme and all checks are completed; you will be eligible for a monthly 'Thank you' payment.
