DEVELOPING SKILLS TEAM

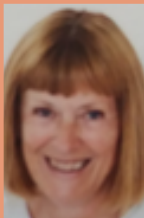

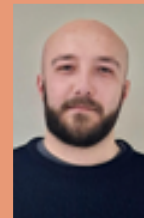

PARTICIPANT CASE STUDIES

Jonathon's story

Jonathon has been working within care for over 2 years. When he started on our project, he was a Recovery Support Worker but has successfully moved on to become an Assistant Practitioner.

Having no formal qualifications in health and social care except for completing internal (on the job) training, Jonathon jumped at the chance to enrol onto our level 2 Mental Health unit with Steadfast training. “I wanted to expand knowledge and ideas and felt it would be at least a refresher in what I already knew.”

“The tutor was really good; she made the subject interesting and engaging and had a good energy level.”

Alongside his course Jonathon was assigned one of our fantastic Career Progression Mentors, Ali. “Initially I wasn't sure if mentoring was for me but the more I chatted with my mentor the more it became beneficial. I feel it's important to explore whether it's for you or not, it only takes a couple of sessions to work out if it's for you.”

Thanks to his mentor's support, Jonathon was able to confidently prepare for an upcoming job interview. Together they looked at what Jonathon was good at and focused on the strengths he was going to bring to the Assistant Practitioner role.

“Mentoring came at a particularly good time, as I was looking to move on to a new job and a mentoring session occurred prior to my interview so we were able to do interview preparation. It helped a lot; gave me a little bit more confidence and I had taken lots of notes to use in the interview.”

During his job interview, Jonathon was even able to share that he was undertaking this level 2 Mental Health unit.

After a successful interview Jonathan has since started his new role and has continued looking for training opportunities to progress his career development.

Overall, when asked how the training and mentoring has benefited those people he worked with, Jonathon said “It makes me better at my job.”
